

Math 203 Computer Exams Fall, 2005

The dates on which the Math 203 computer exams can be taken officially are:

Computer Exam 1 (Chapters 1-3) Sep. 22 – Oct. 3

Computer Exam 2 (Chapters 5-8) Oct. 29 – Nov. 4

The exams are available for anonymous practice (from practically anywhere in the world). To practice, get on any computer with a decent web browser, and point the browser to

On that page you can select “Gateway Exam 1 - practice” or “Gateway Exam 2 - practice”. You are encouraged to practice! (Warning: If the computers running the exams get overloaded, the practice exams may be deactivated.)

To take the exams for credit, you must take them on a proctored basis on the dates indicated at either the Mathlab (Avery 18) or the Arts & Sciences Online Testing Center (Burnett 127). Items to note about this process:

- > You can use a calculator and blank scratch paper, but no books, notes, or other assistance.
- > You will have to provide your UNL student ID at the beginning and end of each proctored exam.
- > You can take each exam at most once per day. Most students should probably allow at least 45 minutes in their schedule for each exam attempt.
- > The first time you take the test on a proctored basis, you will need to register on the system. This involves in part choosing a login name and password that you’ll need to remember whenever you take on of the exams. Make sure you register into the correct section of 203!
- > Each exam will have 8 questions and be graded by the computer on a 40 point basis. (The practice exam is currently graded on an 8 point basis.) Some scores are fractional. Your instructor may choose to round the scores off in some way, or otherwise scale them.
- > If you take the exam on a proctored basis more than once, your highest grade will count, unless you take the exam twice on the same day.

Note that the Mathlab may occasionally be reserved for specific classes during some of its listed hours. Also, in the A&S Testing Center, if you have started an exam you can finish it up to ½ hour after the closing time, whereas in the Mathlab you must be done by the closing time listed.
